Interior

Light, airy and clean main seating area on the ground floor, with a window counter with high stools. There is an attractive decorative fireplace (non-operational). Commercial espresso coffee machine, blender, toaster behind the serving counter. Bungaroosh wall on the stairway. Enclosed split-level patio garden with decorative mural on one wall.

Exterior

Set in; a bohemian area of Brighton occupied by independent retailers, and renowned for it's eclectic nature. The cafe is located on the ground and lower-ground floor of a four storey terrace. There is a large shop-front window, the rest of the windows in the building are sash windows, (with the exception of the toilet windows on the lower ground floor which are steel-casement windows). The street was originally residential, and built in the mid-nineteenth century all the properties are now commercial enterprises. At weekends and on bank holidays, a number of roads in the vicinity are closed to traffic, and shops and stall holders extend trading into the street.
